Scott leaves GA in a very strong financial position enabling us to invest in over 30 strategic plan initiatives which have been identified by the industry as important to enable it to flourish and be recognised as a world-leader in all that we do, with a particular focus on animal welfare and racing integrity.

GA Chairman Anne Marie Harrison acknowledged and thanked Scott for his contribution; "as Chairman I have enjoyed working with Scott and have respected his professionalism, enthusiasm and commitment. His counsel and support in guiding me is appreciated. We wish Scott every success in his future career."
